# Things to know before visiting Singapore



## History

Singapore began life as a small fishing village. It became an important trading port in the 19th century. Singapore gained independence in 1965, and has since become a prosperous, modern city-state known for its economic success and cultural diversity.

## Culture

Singapore is a vibrant, multicultural city-state that has a rich and diverse culture. It offers a unique blend of traditional Asian values and modern Western ideals.



## Currency

The official currency in Singapore is the Singapore Dollar (SGD). Most transactions can be conducted via debit/credit cards, mobile payments and other cashless methods. Cash is still accepted for small purchases in many places like hawker centres and food courts.

- Tipping is not mandatory in Singapore. An 8% GST and a 10% service charge are typically tagged onto the bill at most restaurants or cafés - however, it's always a way to show appreciation for good service.

# Things to know before visiting Singapore (cont.)



## Weather

Singapore experiences a hot and humid tropical climate. The temperature typically ranges from 25°C(77°F) to 33°C(91°F).

- It is recommended to pack light, cool and comfortable clothing.
- Indoor areas are often air-conditioned and can be quite chilly. A light jacket or sweater can be handy.
- Sudden rain showers are common in Singapore; do remember to pack a small umbrella!

## The law

Singapore has strict laws against littering, the sale of chewing gum, and smoking in public areas. Please note that smoking is not allowed in most indoor locations and at certain open public spaces such as at the Orchard Road No Smoking Zone.



## Languages

English is the main communication language in Singapore. Information on Singapore for tourists can be found in English, and some websites provide information in all official languages. Mandarin, Malay, and Tamil are also widely spoken.

# Getting around Singapore

## Changi Airport

Singapore Changi Airport is one of the busiest and highest-rated airports in the world. From the airport, there are many options available to get to Marina Bay Sands hotel and the convention centre, as well as the nearby hotels.

## Reaching the city by taxi

Taxis are available for hire at the taxi stands in the Arrivals areas of Terminals 1, 2 and 3. A ride to the city takes about 20 to 30 minutes. All fares are metered.

To get to the INTA Conference, inform your driver that you are going to the Marina Bay Sands Expo & Convention Centre.

# Getting around Singapore (cont.)

## By train

To get to the city, take the train from Changi Airport MRT Station (CG2) to Tanah Merah MRT Station (EW4), then transfer to the East West Line towards the direction of Tuas Link MRT Station (EW33).

To take the MRT to the INTA Conference, take the train from Changi Airport MRT Station to Expo MRT Station (CG1/DT35), then transfer to the Downtown Line (Blue Line) towards Bayfront MRT Station (DT16/CC4), which is directly connected to the Marina Bay Sands convention centre and hotel. From Exit E of the station, you can directly access the Sands Expo and Convention Centre. MRT services to/from Bayfront MRT station operate daily from approximately 6am to 12am midnight.

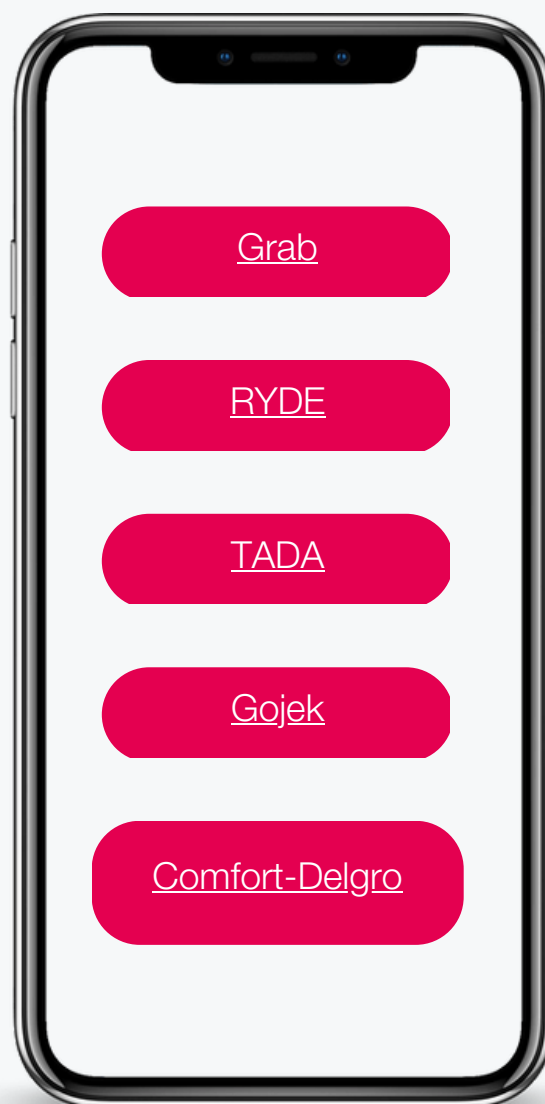
## Payment options for public transport

Payment options include:

- Mastercard/Visa;
- Mobile wallets;
- Cash;
- Singapore Tourist Pass;
- EZ-Link cards - can be purchased at any Changi Recommends store, and TransitLink Ticket Office at any MRT station.
- Please note that admin fees apply for payments made with foreign-issued bank cards.

## Private hire car

Passengers may arrange private hire car transportation from Grab, Gojek, Tada Mobility, or Ryde. Simply download the mobile application of the chosen provider from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store, make a booking, and proceed to the Arrival pick-up points located in Terminals 1, 2 or 3. Please note that Uber is no longer operating in Singapore.
